The Master of Science in Education programs enable teachers to enhance and/or expand on their teaching careers. Literacy, Special Education and Educational Leadership are three specializations offered. The graduate education program also offers post-grad certificates in Literacy and Special Education.

The M.S.Ed. in Educational Leadership prepares teachers for leadership opportunities at the school building level as assistant principals, principals or curriculum specialists. The program leads to eligibility for N.Y.S. School Building Leader (SBL) certification.

The College's Master of Science in Teaching program is designed for bachelor's degree holders who now want to become teachers. This program enables individuals to shift careers and become certified to teach in a subject area, based on their prior undergraduate degree area.

St. Thomas' Teacher Education Programs have been awarded NCATE accreditation. The college offers initial Teacher Education Programs at the baccalaureate level in Childhood Education, Childhood and Special Education, and Adolescence Education.

"We're extremely proud of our NCATE certification and our current students and alumni should be equally proud to participate in a teacher preparation program that is second to none," said Dr. Meenakshi Gajria, chairperson of the division of teacher education.

Most graduate education courses are offered in the late afternoon and evening, as well as during the summer months to work with teaching schedules.
